Betsy was born in Oak Grove, Missouri on January 8, 1935; the first of eight children and the only daughter of Jack and Myrtle (Greer) Saling.

Betsy was united in marriage to Chester Spiwak on June 8, 1950 and they moved to their family farm in Kingsville in 1954. They owned and operated a Grade A dairy servicing Mid-America Dairy Farms until 1989.

Betsy was a Christian who spread the word of God's glory by transplanting seeds and saplings and harvesting the bounties of the vegetation. You don't have to look very far to find a plant or tree that

Betsy was known as "Cookie Grandma" to many of the children that grew up and played ball at the Kingsville ballpark during the 90's and early 2000's. She was always there to give the team cookies to celebrate a win or to console them in a loss. Either way, they were all winners when they got to eat grandma's cookies.
