Evelyn Marie Evans, 87, Lone Jack, Missouri, went home to be with the Lord October 2, 2017 at Holden Manor Care Center, Holden, Missouri. She never simply gave up on anyone or anything. That is part of what made her a successful principal. She said what she meant and stuck to it. I can only think one challenge that she never quite conquered; I still don't eat vegetables. She never gave up on trying though. I will miss walking up to her house with my brother and kids on nice days just to visit. She was always welcoming and kind. I loved looking at the pictures of her family that covered the walls of her home. I will miss hearing her talk about building her home herself. I will miss listening to her talk about being a student in a one room school house, then a teacher in a one room school house and eventually a principal of an elementary school. She has many important roles in her life. She was a mother to four children who she loved with all her heart. She felt blessed to be the wife of her children's father until he passed away. She was then blessed with her second husband who was also a wonderful person. She shared her love for God with those around her. Her faith guided her along her life's journey. I know that her passing is incredibly difficult for her family, but I hope they take comfort in knowing they will see her again. If there is anything I can do, please let me know.
