Jack "Brad" Bradford Alpert, 68, of Kingsville, Missouri passed away Thursday, October 29, 2020 at his home. Brad was born on December 29, 1951 in Sedalia, Missouri the son of Jack and Barbara (Rice) Alpert. He graduated from Smith Cotton High School in Sedalia, Missouri the class of 1970. 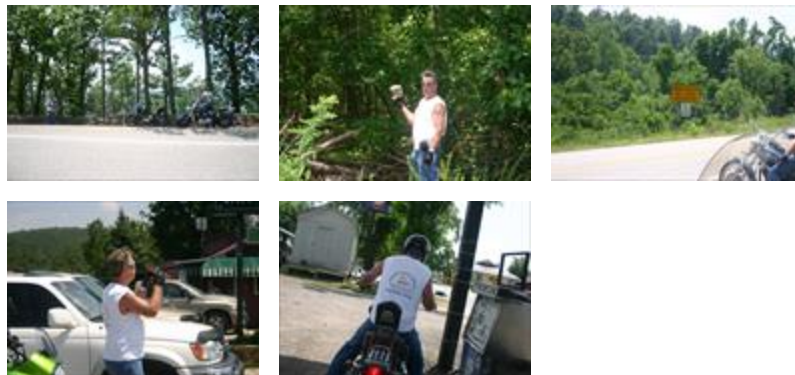
