Lawson P. "Bud" Moore, June 30, 1933 – July 21, 2021, was born in LaMonte, Missouri to Pete C. Moore and Mary Anna (Finch) Moore. He graduated from LaMonte High School in 1952 and left immediately for the US Air Force. Serving his country in Korea, Iwo Jima, Okinawa, the Philippine Islands, Formosia, Indochina, Guam, Midway Islands, Hawaii, and California. He was honorably discharged at the rank of staff sergeant in May of 1956.

After returning to the states, he returned to the Kansas City area, finding the love of his life, Rose Ann Mergen, to whom he was married for 58 years. He was baptized in the Catholic Faith in 1962. After retiring from General Motors in 1995 he enjoyed working on the farm with his cows, fishing with his son, Michael, and spending time with his family.

Bud was a member of the NRA, the United Auto Workers Local #14, and the Knights of Columbus.

He is preceded in death by his parents, Pete, and Mary Anna Moore and one sister, Blanche "Maxine" Thompson.

He leaves behind his loving wife, Rose Ann Moore of Kingsville, MO; two sons, Michael A. Moore and special friend, Jan Choate of Holden, MO, Harold K. Moore and wife, Michelle of Pleasant Hill, MO; two daughters, Wanda M.

“It’s quite telling there’s a lack of condolences because I am going to say it: A benevolent God certainly did not accept Lawson Pete “L. P.” Moore into the pearly gates because he preyed more than he prayed.



When we met at Innsbrook Apartments in Toledo, Ohio, I was a six-year-old child and he was 58. Coincidentally, he was same age as my loving, actually Catholic, working-class Grandfather who, along with my Grandmother, had endured hell in the legal system over the irresponsibility of my parents. That’s a story for another day. What was supposed to be a fresh start quickly turned into a nightmare when I met the man from apartment 121.

I have always enjoyed exploring and Innsbrook was a haven of sorts, surrounded by woods, retailers, and other multi-unit dwellings. Kids were everywhere and I enjoyed friendships with many of them. Like Amanda, who had the same panda tee from the Toledo Zoo. I still have the picture that sparks bittersweet memories,

While I can’t pinpoint how we met, children freely played outdoors in 1991 and L. P. would sit outside watching. My naïveté projected my Papa onto him, befriending him as an adult I could trust. I often visited him when I missed my grandparents, watching him prepare meals for his shift at GM Powertrain down the street.

I don’t know when the touching began but I think it was when he’d pick me up and “tickle” me. It never felt good and to think he had eight grandchildren makes my stomach turn and my heart ache. Before I knew it, L.P. was often violating boundaries in ways I’d prefer not to rehash. A traumatised child isn’t aware when they’re bleeding underwater that sharks sense and feed off it.

Three years later, I confessed to a Guidance Counsellor what had happened. She was a weekly appointment, as my behavioural issues became mysterious classroom disruptions. L.P. stole my

innocence and the opportunity for justice when he suddenly “retired” from GM after Children Services arrived for questioning. Like Lucifer in the flesh, he ran back to Missouri and was never tried for the errors of his ways.

Judging by the photos he aged like spoiled milk. It’s particularly rich he was concerned about his second amendment rights when he’d freely violate first of many, saying what was happening was a secret. When he left, he had moved onto a three-year-old victim. Truly, truly the scum of the earth. He won’t be missed and is not the person Phil, Lori, Sandy, or Dick knew.

I light a teal candle to ensure he eternally burns in the fieriest pit and to release the pain carried for over 30 years. May the suffering inner children be healed from people like L. P.!
