



Mark "Marko" A. Suthers

Mark A. Suthers, age 66 passed away October 3rd, 2021 at his home with his wife and his son at his side. He was known as "Marko" to his brother. He was born August 21, 1955 to Marvin and the late Marie Suthers (Davis) in St. Joseph Missouri. Mark spent most of his life in Kansas City where his class of 1974 was the first to graduate from Hickman Mills High School. After high school he joined the Navy during the Vietnam Era. After serving his country he became an apprentice with the Boilermakers Local Union 83 and then became a journeyman welder for Local 83.

He was a member of the American Legion where he was the Commander for Hickman Mills Memorial Post 598 for 7 years. When the post closed he transferred to Robert L. Clore Post 189 in Lee's Summit. He loved spending time with his family and friends along with his special fur baby, Angel.

“ Mark and I were very good friends in our high school days. We worked together at McDonald's at 87th and Blue Ridge for a couple of years, and then we both went to work for Pizza Hut from there. We went to different high schools but hung around together all the time. We spent a lot of our time with car buddies, street racing, hitting the 18 bars in Kansas, and generally just having a good time. We both joined the Navy at different times. He had the misfortune of joining early enough that he spent time in Vietnam resulting in PTSD. I was in submarines, and by the time I finished my training and went to sea for the first time the US was out of Vietnam. After we both joined the Navy we lost track of one another. I was able to reconnect through Facebook a few years ago, and we met in Kansas City for lunch when I was back home on a business trip. We stayed in touch on occasion afterward but lived too far apart to really get close again. Earlier this year I made a trip back to KC specifically to spend quality time with Mark since I had heard of his brain cancer. I left our afternoon visit so encouraged by his upbeat and positive attitude. I was also greatly encouraged by the faith in God that we both share. He was a fun guy to be around as long as I knew him. I called and talked to him on a facetime video call just an hour before his passing. He was not responsive, but I hope he could hear me as I shared my love for him and his wife Lorena, and then prayed over them. He will be missed, but I look forward to seeing him again in eternity.
