Ronald Keith Brooks, 63, of Warrensburg, formerly of Columbia passed away Friday, Dec. 20 at the Warrensburg Manor Care Center. Ron was born June 2, 1956 to Glenn O. and Wanda Lee Brooks of Holden. Ron was a 1974 graduate of Holden High School, 1975 and 1978 graduate of the Marine Corps ROTC Bootcamp in Parris Island, SC, and 1978 graduate of the University of Missouri School of Engineering. In 1992 he married Susan Skinner of Ashland, MO. Ron was a Mechanical Engineer for 3M in Columbia for 25 years before retiring from 3M in Simi Valley, CA in 2014.
