Walter "Walt" Eugene Borer, 85, of Pleasant Hill, Missouri passed away Saturday, August 22, 2020 at Cass Regional Medical Center in Harrisonville, Missouri. Walt was born on January 9, 1935 in Pleasant Hill, MO the son of Eugene Alphonse and Fern Elisabeth (Duncan) Borer.

Walt attended High School in Holden, MO, the class of 1952. After High School, he served in the United States Army.
